Accolades & Opportunities for REACH Horses for Heroes Program

The Equine Services for Heroes program is doing well and there are some interesting things going on.

REACH recently received a copy of Texas Resolution; H. R. No. 1952, signed by Charles "Doc" Anderson, State Representative District 56, Speaker of the House, Joe Straus, and Chief Clerk of the House, Robert Haney. A small segment from that resolution follows:

"RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Legislature hereby congratulates all those involved with the Horses for Heroes program on winning first place float at the McLennan County Veterans' Day Parade and extends to them sincere best wishes for the future."


A complete copy of this document will be kept at the REACH office. Please take a moment to look at it when you have time.

We have been coordinating with Dr. Beth Lanning of Baylor University to position REACH as one of three centers that will participate in an upcoming research study. The study involves the examination of the effects of equine-assisted activities on PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) symptoms. REACH will be participating with the Ride On Center for Kids of Georgetown, Texas, and Rainier Therapeutic Riding Center, located in Yelm, Washington. Dr. Lanning submitted the 127-page grant request last week. The study is set to begin in January of 2014.

Finally, REACH has another opportunity to assist veterans with PTSD coming up this fall. The Veterans Administration in Waco has offered us an opportunity to receive between four and eight veterans one afternoon a week. This program has previously been at Ropin' Hope Rehabilitation in Bremond, Texas. That facility is closing and we were highly recommended by their Executive Director, Becky Aaron. The patients are enrolled in a controlled eight-week program for treatment of PTSD. The VA will bring the veterans out for three hours one afternoon each week to enjoy being around horses and learning basic horsemanship. The VA will also bring therapists and other equine specialists.
